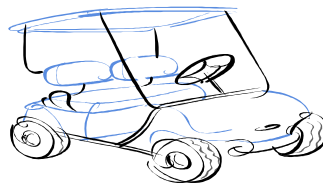

Rule 28: Ball Unplayable

The player may declare his ball unplayable anywhere on the course except when it lies in a water hazard. This includes when the ball lies on the putting green, the middle of the fairway, in a bunker or in a more typical unplayable lie, such as a ball between tree roots, or one deeply embedded in a bunker.

In proceeding under the unplayable ball Rule, the player has 3 options, all under penalty of one stroke. Option (a) allows the player to return to where he last played, the stroke and distance penalty. If the unplayable lie is in a bunker, this is the only option that will allow the player to exit the bunker when the previous stroke was played from outside the bunker. Under option (b), the player may drop a ball behind the point where the original ball lies, keeping that point between the hole and where the ball is dropped. There is no limit to how far back the player may drop the ball, except that if in a bunker, the player must drop the ball in the bunker. Under the last option, **Rule 28c**, the player may drop a ball within two club-lengths of, and not nearer the hole than, the spot where the ball originally lay. Just as in option (b), if the ball originally lay in a bunker and the player elects option (c), the ball must be dropped in a bunker.

Junior Golfers (under 15 years of age) are allowed to wear t-shirts on the golf course. They must respect older players and heavy play may dictate their times on the course. Junior golfers accompanied by an adult are allowed on the course at all times in accordance with the general rules of the club.

Recipe of the Month
Buffalo Wings

- 6 pounds chicken wings*
- 4 (0.7-ounce) envelopes Italian salad dressing mix, divided
- 1 cup butter, melted
- 1 to 1 1/2 cups hot sauce
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- Ranch dressing

Cut off wingtips, and discard; cut chicken wings in half at joint, if desired. Place 1 package Italian salad dressing mix in a large zip-top plastic bag; add half of wings, and shake to coat. Arrange coated wings in a single layer on a lightly greased rack in an aluminum foil-lined 15- x 10-inch jelly-roll pan. Repeat procedure with 1 package Italian salad dressing mix, remaining half of wings, and another jelly-roll pan.

Bake at 425° for 35 minutes or until browned. Remove pans from oven, and reduce heat to 350°.

Stir together remaining 2 packages Italian salad dressing mix, butter, and next 3 ingredients in a large bowl; add wings, and toss until evenly coated. Return wings to racks in pans, and bake at 350° for 30 more minutes. Serve with Ranch dressing.

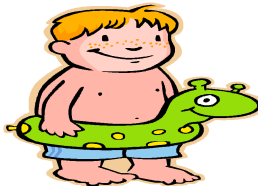
Yield: Makes 10 to 12 appetizer servings

The following is SCC's late payment policy. This policy applies to all outstanding balances at month end regardless of dollar amount. To avoid a late fee, your payment must be received at the Club office no later than the last day of the month. Please note that the Club offers bank drafting for your convenience.

All statements are due upon receipt and are considered past due on the 20th of each month. A grace period will exist after the 20th until the end of that month. Those bills not paid by the end of the month will be assessed a \$25 late charge and considered 30 days past due. If the bill remains unpaid the following month, the bill will be considered 60 days past due and assessed \$50 in addition to the previous month's \$25 for a total of \$75. All club privileges will be revoked at that point. Membership termination and forfeiture of club stock, if applicable, will be enforced at 90 days past due.
